Finally, some sunshine and good news! **We are ALL to be back on Monday 8<sup>th</sup> March**! EP staff are just so happy! Everyone is well and raring to go. We will pick up where we left off so:

- Google classroom and all remote provision will cease on Friday 5<sup>th</sup> March
- Full normal days for everyone (9-3.30pm)
- Attendance is mandatory
- Main gate: Years 1,3,4,5
- Raveley St Gate: Nursery, Reception, Year 2 and Year 6
- Gates open at 8.45. Children wash hands and go straight into class
- Please be there to collect on time and wait, socially distanced and ideally, in a regular spot. Please continue to wear a mask at both drop off and pick up
- We will maintain all our in-school routines from last term such as class bubbles, hand-washing and our zoned playground
- Staff now do home lateral flow tests twice a week. There is no plan to ask primary aged children to do these tests
- We will have to close class bubbles for 10 days again should a child test positive. PLEASE do not send
  your child into school if anyone in your household is symptomatic. Tests are now readily available
  locally and results are fast
- Please keep in close touch with school about any possible symptoms, testing and absence.
- Breakfast Club and Club EP will resume on March 8<sup>th</sup> too so please book on line as before. Don't delay as these places filled up quickly in the Autumn term!
- Please return all loaned chromebooks on Monday ideally in original box, with the charging cable to the office.

## Catch up

There is a so much in the press (and my in-box!) about 'catch up', from extending the school day to summer school. We are not making any such plans. Our priority will be to rapidly settle back into class, assessing what has 'stuck' during home learning and adjusting our teaching accordingly so we focus on the key building blocks. If we feel there are children who need extra, then we will offer targeted support either in the school day or around the school day. We will use known members of staff for this.

What we must do is push learning **onwards** as well as going backwards; teachers have felt so frustrated not having class dialogue to probe, extend and deepen understanding as well as to clarify misconceptions.

We will offer our full arts and sports curriculum and ensure children get masses of time to chat and play and to be outside. We may however, lock away the laptops for a few weeks!
