## **Message from the Heads**

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a busy yet brilliant first half of term, with the autumn leaves in full splendour across our site and beyond, and the children settling into new classes to form our wonderful community. The variety of learning experiences taking place in all our classes for Black History Month was really striking - from parent and author visits to online lessons led by the British Library - thank you to everyone who contributed.





November is the time in the school year when children enhance and expand their knowledge, exploring the curriculum inside the classroom and beyond, including more wonderful workshops and trips. You should start to see your child's understanding of their topics grow— why not quiz them using their EP Knowledge Organisers?

One of the most powerful things you can do as a parent is to chat to your child about their learning because this interrupts their forgetting, helping to grow that treasury of primary memories, which we aim for them to take with them wherever they go.



Continuing the theme of growing, our gardener, Bernadette, has worked with Year 3 and Year 4 this year to grow and harvest lots of vegetables. The Good To Grow Harvest-o-meter shows we have beaten our target to reach 180 meals - we have 201 meals so far with more to come!

This means that we have produced 16.11 kgs of food and saved £333.46 plus a huge amount of CO2. Nursery is harvesting artichokes so there should be more to come!

There's excitement around the upcoming EP traditions, such as the Winter Concert and the EP Variety Show. Below are the details, so you can encourage your child to practise song lyrics and perhaps consider stepping up to read a poem if they're interested. Thinking ahead, we usually say that children can wear a top in a Christmassy colour at the Concert and at the Christmas lunch. **Please** do not feel any pressure to buy something new, however. We would love to arrange a Christmas jumper swap box following on from our brilliant PTA idea of swapping outer-wear!











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READY RESPECTFUL SAFE

Next week is **Anti-bullying Week** - such a crucial time to raise awareness of behaviour, which impacts lives so profoundly. This year, the Anti-bullying Alliance has chosen the theme - **Choose Respect** - perfect for EP and our three rules of Ready, Respectful and Safe! Through assemblies, stories and lessons next week, children will be learning how we can work together to stop bullying behaviour and to build a world full of kindness and respect. **You can show support for this mission by wearing odd socks to school on Tuesday 12th November – it's Odd Socks Day! # Odd Socks Day - Tuesday 12th November

Odd Socks Day supports **Anti-bullying week** and **we encourage all children to wear odd socks on this day** to represent our beautiful differences. It's a day to join together to show that it's ok to be different and to stand up against bullying and discrimination.



**EP Disco, Friday 15th November, 6-8pm!** Music, photo booth, food and a bar. Join the party in the hall. Entry is £3 adults and children can enter free. <u>Children must be accompanied by an adult who will be responsible for them during the event and each adult should be responsible for no more than 2-3 children. Since this is a school event, all our normal rules apply and children should not have mobile phones.</u>

**Winter Concert poetry readers -** if your child would like to audition to read at the Winter Concert please let the class teacher know by next Friday 15th November - with auditions held in the next two weeks with Sally, Natalie or Rosie. In previous years, this has mainly been children from the Juniors, but if there is a child in a younger year who feels confident learning a verse and speaking at the concert, please let class teachers know. We will hand out a selection of poems before the audition to learn a few lines from.

**The EP Variety Show** is held on the last day of this term, **December 20th**. Two acts are selected from each class and will perform in the variety show competition. Children can perform alone or with classmates. We welcome a wide range of acts - dance, music, comedy, magic and more! Class auditions take place in w/c 18th November - with class teachers arranging the best time for the children. Please check class newsletters for exact days.

**Monday 25th November at 3:45pm** - Everyone is welcome to join the PTA AGM. It is through this meeting that together we decide how the money you've raised at all the wonderful fundraising events is spent.
